TOWN BOARD MEETING

Supervisor Michael Grace called the meeting to order

EXECUTIVE SESSION

Upon motion made by Supervisor Grace, seconded by Councilman Bernard, the Town Board moved into Executive Session to discuss the employment of particular people. Upon motion made by Supervisor Grace, seconded by Councilman Diana, to move out of Executive Session and proceed with the Town Board meeting.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Supervisor Grace led the salute to the flag.

MOMENT OF SILENCE

A moment of silence was observed in honor of our men and women serving in the Armed Forces.

<u>DURING REPORTS FROM TOWN SUPERVISOR</u>, Supervisor Grace stated that Town Taxes are due by April 30, 2015. He also thanked the volunteers who participated in the Battle of Yorktown, the town's campaign against roadside litter.

Councilman Vishnu Patel congratulated Dr. Nalini Rau who was recently honored by the Arts Westchester 50/50 for her extraordinary contribution to Bharatnatyam indian classical dance as dancer, choreographer and teacher. She is a resident of the Town of Yorktown.

Councilwoman Susan Siegel also thanked the volunteers who participated in the Battle of Yorktown. The Councilwoman also stated that FERC, the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission will hold a meeting in Yorktown on May 11, 2015 at the YCCC concerning Spectra Energy's Atlantic Bridge Project.

Councilman Gregory Bernard stated that the Water Department has begun its annual hydrant flushing on April 17, 2015. He also read the Public Safety Report dated April 13, 2015, a copy of which is included with these minutes.

Councilman Diana explained that nearly six hundred people signed up as volunteers for last weekend's Battle of Yorktown. He also explained that the Yorktown Citizens Task Force on Heroin will hold its second roundtable meeting at the Elks Club on April 29, 2015.

Mr. Jay Kopstein read from a prepared statement, a copy of which is on file in the Town Clerk's Office. He stated that Mrs. Kim Angliss-Gage gave an excellent presentation concerning trash collection last week. Mr. Kopstein noted that on the Town's website it states that all single family residences in the Garbage District are charged the same tax and are permitted two 32 gallon containers, not to exceed sixty pounds, twice a week for trash pickup. He asked that the owners of 482 Underhill Avenue be made aware of this "requirement".

Mrs. Ann Kutter and Mr. Ron Buehl spoke about the Arbor Day Ceremony scheduled to take place on Friday, May 1, 2015. The ceremony will include a tree planting in honor of Lorraine DeSisto who passed away last year. Mrs. DeSisto was instrumental in the reestablishment of Arbor Day in the Town of Yorktown. The winners of the annual poster contest, which features artwork from 5th graders will be on display in Town Hall for the month of May. The winners of last year's contest will have their posters featured on banners displayed on light poles throughout the Town of Yorktown. Volunteers will plant trees at Sylvan Glen Park on May 2, 2015.

Mr. Paul Moskowitz thanked the Town Board for hosting last week's meeting with Spectra Energy. He also stated that some of the responses from the representatives were not truthful.

Mrs. Rosemarie Panio read from a prepared statement, a copy of which is on file in the Town Clerk's Office. She expressed her feelings about the tax increase voted on by the Town Board last year and asked that proposed projects in various parts of Yorktown be given due consideration since they have the potential to better fund the Town as well as future school budgets.

Mr. Dan Lefkowitz asked a series of questions including who are the liaisons to various boards and whether work sessions will be televised.

Councilwoman Siegel provided responses to some of the issues raised during Courtesy of the Floor.

PUBLIC HEARING

PROPOSED LOCAL LAW AMENDING CHAPTER 300 SETTING A FEE FOR A SPECIAL USE PERMIT FOR A COOP FOR FOWL ON RESIDENTIAL LOT

Supervisor Grace called to order a public hearing to amend Chapter 300 of the Zoning Code of the Town of Yorktown, setting a fee for a Special Use Permit for a coop for fowl on a residential lot. The Town Clerk presented affidavits of printing and publication.

Mrs. Nicole Fervan, spoke on behalf of her family and the Yorktown Grange opposing the proposal.

Mrs. Barbara Wilkins, Chairman of the Westchester County Agriculture and Farmland Protection Board stated that under New York State Law, the Town Board must look at the effect of any action it takes on property located within the County's Farmland Protection Board. There should have been an exemption in this law to farms included in the County's Farmland Protection Board.

Ms. Helen Flonay expressed concern about the fees in this law. She will send the Town Board examples of other municipalities' laws concerning fowl.

Mrs. Olivia Buehl spoke in opposition to the proposal.

The Chairman of the Westchester Putnam Grange spoke in opposition to the proposal.

Mr. Paul Moskowitz spoke in opposition to the proposal.

Mr. Paul Rafone also spoke in opposition to the proposal.

Mrs. Babette Ballinger spoke in opposition to the proposal.

Mr. John Winter, Building Inspector for the Town of Yorktown explained how this proposal came about.

Mr. Steve Robbins stated that he believes the fee in the proposal is excessive.

Jackie Zag spoke in opposition to the law.

Mr. Fred Golden also opposed the law.

Ms. Jenelle Robbins stated that why do chickens need an Animal Waste Management Plan?

Mr. Gil Kaufman asked if the Town of Yorktown was going to be a tree town or a chicken town.

All those present having been given the opportunity to be heard and there being no further discussion, upon motioned made by Councilman Bernard, seconded by Councilman Diana, the Public Hearing was closed.
