RECONVENE PUBLIC HEARING

REQUEST FOR REZONING 3574 LEXINGTON AVENUE

Supervisor Grace reconvened a public hearing to consider a petition filed by RPG Properties, Inc. seeking a zoning map amendment and a proposed local law to amend the Town of Yorktown zoning map, as follows:

Section I. The Zoning Map of the Town of Yorktown, New York as established under Chapter 300 of the Code of the Town of Yorktown is hereby amended as follows: The following lot on the Tax Map of the Town of Yorktown is rezoned from the R1-20 Zoning District to the R-3 zoning district: Section 15.15, Parcel 1, Lot 22 (15.15-1-22) (approximately one acre) Affidavits of posting and publication were presented by the Town Clerk.

Mr. Evan Bray stated that this rezoning will affect the current value of his home. He has no issue with diverse housing but feels this is not the right area for this type of project.

Councilman Bernard stated that there was a Plan A which had parking on the inside of buildings and a Plan B which had parking on the outside for this project. Plan A did not work.

Supervisor Grace explained the differences between what the property is currently zoned at and what it would be if the rezoning is granted.

Mrs. Susan Siegel asked if the Town Board intended to close the public hearing tonight and if the resolution would be available for review.

Mrs. Andrea Jeffries stated that this building will change the character of the community. She has not be able to find anything on this company and would like the Town Board to protect the citizens of this community.

Mr. Thomas Perrone stated that this will directly affect his home. The area is zoned for 1 family homes and should stay that way. He does not feel this is favorable to

the area and the people don't want it. A petition was filed with the Town against this project. This will also have an effect on the Lakeland School District taxes.

Mr. Paul Jeffries asked what is to stop this from happening all over the Town. There is a need for diverse housing but this is not the right area for this type of project. There will be a change to the character of the community, increase in traffic, and he does not believe this type of housing stock is needed.

Mr. Ed Ciffone spoke about the housing going in on Kear Street, the Bernstein property and Mandalay Builders, he stated that this type of rezoning can set a precedent that will lead to this type of future development all over Town.

Supervisor Grace stated that the Town does not vet applicants that come before them with an application. He does not feel that this will set a precedent to other developers if it is rezoned and the Town will take a look at the traffic issues.

Councilman Bernard stated that the Planning Board and Zoning Board will review the site plans. The Town Board can make stipulations in the rezoning resolution to limit the amount of units proposed on this property.

Supervisor Grace stated that the Town Board will accept written comments until June 7, 2016.

All those present having been given the opportunity to be heard and there being no further discussion, the hearing was closed. Upon motion by Councilman Diana, seconded by Councilman Bernard and carried.

Mrs. Susan Siegel asked about the passive recreation component versus the fee in lieu of for recreational purposes.

Supervisor Grace stated that this would not be active recreation.

Mr. Jay Kopstein asked if the ZBA and Planning Board would have to approve the variance because others were done.

Supervisor Grace stated that the Town Board can box the Planning Board in and give direction to Planning Board.

Mr. Tom Perrone stated he is sorry that the Supervisor took umbrage to his comments.

Supervisor Grace stated he loves Mohegan Lake and wants to improve the area.

Mr. Tom Perrone stated then put developers behind your house. Protect us not the developers.

Supervisor Grace stated that he appreciated everyone's comments tonight.
