Purpose of Request

MLID's existing wetlands permit has expired. We have applied for a new general wetlands permit to cover our activities. Everything we do is within the lake or within the 150' Mohegan Lake wetlands buffer.

Requested Actions

- 1. Determine whether this is an administrative permit that can be issued by the Town Engineer, or whether it must be reviewed/issued by the Town Board after a public hearing.
- 2. If it requires Town Board review, we request a quick referral to required boards/agencies, so the Town Board can review feedback and schedule a public hearing as soon as possible.
- 3. It is our hope that this can be accomplished in time to allow our 2018 lake treatments to take place.

Scope of our Work

- Litter cleanup
- Water testing
- Weed harvesting
- Maintenance of aeration sheds and lake access
- Maintenance of aeration system (in-lake tubing and diffusers and on-shore compressors)
- Removal of invasive species, such as
 - Water chestnut
 - o Curly-leaf pondweed
 - o Eurasian milfoil
- Fish Stocking
- Chemical treatments to maintain the health of the lake*
 - o Copper Sulfate or Cutrine Ultra to control excessive blue green algae blooms
 - Nutrient Inactivators such as Alum to bind phosphorus
- Educational activities
- Annual "Lake Day"
- Trail maintenance
- Use of boats to conduct work on the lake
- Hiring of lake management companies and limnologists to prepare and implement water quality improvement plans
- Reviewing BMPs (Best Management Practices) to reduce phosphorus inputs from watershed
