The Refuse & Recycling Department of the Town of Yorktown (population 36,000), located in northern Westchester County, New York, is interested in starting a comprehensive Textile Recovery Program. The purpose is to reduce the municipal waste stream and lower the Town's costs while providing its residents with a convenient and environmentally sound textile waste disposal option.

It is envisioned that the Refuse & Recycling Department will provide curbside collection of used textiles in clear plastic bags from its residents, and then transfer the filled bags to a stationary collection pod and/or container (owned by the contractor) that will be sited on Town-owned property. The contractor will also provide three to five standard-sized used clothing bins to be placed on other Town-owned properties for residents to directly deposit textiles.

The successful contractor will compensate the Town of Yorktown for the use of public property (franchise). The fee will be based on the weight of the collected used textiles, a monthly rental, a combination of the two, or any other basis that is acceptable to the Town.

The successful contractor will be required to:

- 1. Provide a turnkey program at no-cost to the Town of Yorktown.
- 2. Furnish a tamper-proof stationary heavy gauge metal collection pod and/or container, approximately 20 cubic yard capacity that will be placed in a predetermined location, behind the Refuse & Recycling Department, 2279 Crompond Road, Yorktown Hts., New York.
- 3. Furnish three (3) to five (5) standard heavy gauge metal and tamper-proof used clothing bins, to be sited on predetermined Town-owned properties in the Town of Yorktown.
- Empty the collection pod and used clothing bins on a scheduled and/or on-call basis and provide transportation of all material deposited in the pod and bins.
- 5. Provide collection reports detailing the weight of collected textiles from the main pod and used clothing bins, and compensate the Town of Yorktown, on a monthly basis, the contracted amount based on the weight of used textiles.
- 6. Own, maintain and insure all collection units. Maintenance shall include, but not be limited to, fresh paint, legible signage and general upkeep to maintain community standards.
 - a. No third-party advertising will be permitted on any of the containers.

7. Remove the collection units no later than 15 days after the termination of the contract.

The successful firm may be required to:

- 1. Furnish a bond guaranteeing the removal of the containers.
- 2. Provide checkable references of other customers, including municipal customers with similar programs. Prior New York State municipal experience is preferred but not required.

5.	Please address how you handle inquiries for lost property, i.e. if a resident claims to have left a valuable object in a pocket of a collected item of clothing.
6.	Please describe your reporting capabilities, including what kind of system you use to track the textiles collected. Attach samples of reports that you have generated for other municipal customers.
7.	Provide information on payment (including price per pound/ton, method of payment, payment schedule).
8.	Describe your company and its history.

Where (1) (2) and (3) above have not been complied with, the bid shall not be considered for award nor shall any award be made unless the head of the purchasing unit of the political subdivision, public department, agency or official thereof to which the bid is made, or his designee, determines that such disclosure was not made for the purpose of restricting competition.
