Dear Yorktown Town Clerk, Ms. Diana Quast,

Please pass on my comments regarding both developments on Route 6 near 6N, the Recycling Transfer Station adjacent to Whispering Pines and the large housing development off of Navajo. My family opposes both developments and here is why:

- 1. They are not in the character of Yorktown, a small suburban community, that has ALREADY seen (and will see) numerous building projects, including an unsightly solar farm not even a mile away, that, collectively, are changing the nature of Yorktown from a small, bucolic and charming town into a more congested, more city-like, dense atmosphere. Question: Could these large-scale developments actually be condoned by the Comprehensive Plan? I would like you to reject these plans entirely. But if you cannot reject these plans, can you please ask that each plan reduce the size of their project and allow hundreds of the trees closer to Route 6 to remain intact?
- 2. They will cause even more of an undue hardship on traffic on Route 6. Already there are times of day where Route 6 is very congested with commuters, public buses, school buses and speeding drivers. Over the last 10 years, the corridor of Route 6 has been tested, taxed, overrun, changed, added to, densified and made more dangerous. From the huge "The Mews" development and Mrs. Greens development just over the border in Mahopac, to the Hidden Meadow development to the extension of Gay Ridge Road (Winchester Court), to the Overlay District being created within the Lake Osceola area and the purchasing of land and buildings there by Unicorn Development, to the Solar Farm on Hill Blvd. to the new Taco Bell drive thru in Mohegan Lake, to enormous development in housing Chipotle and ShopRite in Cortlandt, all on Route 6 in the last 10 years and within the Lakeland School District that utilizes the entire length of Route 6 as an absolute necessity every day. And further, countless, dangerous accidents have occurred along this stretch of road, including in 2016, the death of a beloved Nun, Sister Barbara Heil, who taught at John F. Kennedy High School. One nun killed, another injured, in head-on crash Mid Hudson News Question: Do you

have plans on widening Route 6? And if not, how can you justify adding more cars to this road when there are so many people, students, buses, commuters, residents and emergency vehicles using this road each day?

- 3. Lakeland Schools is already an enormous school district. It is twice the size of the Yorktown School District. It comprises 5 elementary schools from K-5. The middle school has 1,500 students plus teachers, administration and staff. It's so big, it has two gyms, a swimming pool and two cafeterias. Then the middle school splits into two high schools. We cannot afford to add any more students. We don't have the space or the teachers. And so even if any developments call for "senior" housing, any of those homes could easily be rented or bought by families too or rules could change at some point and exceptions can be made and more and more children could be added to Lakeland Schools. This is an undue and unfair burden upon the families of The Lakeland School District in Yorktown. When we purchased our homes here, NONE of this was anticipated or expected. We deserve the right to enjoy the benefits of excellent and uncrowded schools. Question: Can you lower the density in all of the development projects being suggested for this region? Can you promise all the citizens that no new students will be added to the schools?
- 4. The senseless destruction of Trees, Open Space and Habitat. There has been so much development in Yorktown over the last 20 years and this has accelerated over the last 10 years. We have lost 1000s and 1000s of trees throughout Yorktown. There are grave consequences to this. Everytime a tree is felled, it's gone forever and the forest it's attached to is closer to being destroyed. If a forest is destroyed, its natural filtration system is gone and air, water and soil can no longer be naturally filtered and will not be as clean. Add pesticide, fertilizer and chemical run-off from homes and businesses and our environment will just not be as clean and might even be toxic. Songbirds and migrating birds will die or will go elsewhere. Sleeping cicadas will die, never to emerge after 17 years. Trees help fight Climate Change. I would think Yorktown would want to be progressive and help fight climate change by preserving its important tree canopy as a wonderful asset. Removing forests kill native plants and habitat that sustain ground animals as well as our waterways and its aquatic and amphibian animals. Animals that help keep insects and vermin out of our homes will no longer be present. We rely on bats, owls, hawks, coyotes, foxes, snakes, opossums, frogs and toads to control ticks, flying insects, mice and rats. More development means more roadkill. It's terrifically sad that the swans that have been present in the pond on Granite Springs Road by Curry Street have either died or left. This has not happened in the entire time I've lived in Yorktown. We've always had two swans there, until 6 months ago. I think this egregious and profoundly sad circumstance is indicative of the attitude that Yorktown has towards its nature - that it's there to use and abuse and not to care and share. Yorktown is a family town but it's not acting like a family town. Because if Yorktown acted like a family town, conservation of its nature would be first on the list. Everyone knows that what is good for children is also good for the environment. Don't believe me? Maybe you can believe The Nature Conservancy: Getting Kids Outside | The Nature Conservancy

Question: How many trees and forests is okay for Yorktown to cut down? Can you tear down any existing buildings and return that land into forested land? Isn't open space and greenery good for Yorktowners to get to see and live near? Isn't this why we bought our homes here, for the greenery and peaceful natural areas? And so if greenery isn't important to you, then why is it part of your selling point of Yorktown throughout your town website. Regarding the developments discussed in

this email, can you reduce the number of trees cut with the developers? Can you fight for 40% or 50% MORE trees to remain on their site plans?


